## **Governor Visit - Pupil Wellbeing in School**

We really enjoyed coming into school to talk to a group of year 3, 4, 5 and 6 children about pupil wellbeing. The children told us all about the Ethos Crew:

"If you are part of the Ethos Crew, you wear a red hat and a small florescent jacket like the dinner ladies, and you go around the playground and make sure everyone is getting on. If there are fallings out or arguments, you try to sort them out and help anyone who is unhappy before going to the teacher".

We learnt that the children do this by asking what's happened, encouraging the children to stop and really listen to each other and to see the situation from both sides. The Ethos Crew also look out for all children in the play-ground e.g. if someone hasn't got a playmate, they might partner them up with others and bring about integration. We learnt about the Buddy Stop – a stop to the left of the front door (look out for it!) where children can wait if they feel like they want someone to play with. The children said this feels like a safety net:

"It's not used that much but it's really good to know it's there".

We asked if anyone can be part of the Ethos Crew:

"Yes, if you tell Miss Vasey you want to do it. Younger and older children can do it and someone from class 2 has been on the Ethos Crew... wouldn't it be funny if a class 2 person sorted an argument with 2 year 6s!"

The children also told us about the school initiative of Circle Time – "When you sit in a big circle in class and you talk about stuff... any issues that come up, like waste in the canteen". We were really pleased to hear that the children felt this was a fair and inclusive way of discussing school issues, with quieter children having just as much of a chance to speak (and being encouraged to do so) as more confident children.

This visit was part of our learning about Restorative Practice – a new approach to communicating and resolving issues within school that enables children to focus on speaking, listening and understanding one another to resolve conflict and have a harmonious school life.

## **Holidays During Term Time**

**Please be aware that children ARE NOT permitted to take holidays during term time except in very exceptional circumstances. 'Cheaper holidays' are not classed as exceptional circumstances.**

**If you take your child/ren out of school for more than 1 week (10 sessions) we might have to send a penalty notice to NYCC, which could result in a fine.**

**This depends upon the child's current attendance. The school does not receive any information or the funds from NYCC.**



## Universal Credit earning threshold for free school meals from 1 April

**From 1 April 2018, the government are introducing a Universal Credit earning threshold of £7,400 per year for free school meal eligibility.**

This means that some families who are eligible now would not be if they apply after 1 April. Also, children eligible for free school meals by 1 April will continue to receive them until at least 2022, without the need for further eligibility checks while Universal Credit is rolled out across the country.

If you receive Universal Credit and are not already claiming free school meals for your children, or you have not applied as your child is currently in Key Stage 1 (universal free school meals), make sure you don't miss out and [please apply now \(pdf / 189 KB\)](#). (press control and click)

### **Reminders**

Please ensure that you let the office know of any changes to home time arrangements and check the newsletter for club information. The newsletters are on the website for reference- if you are not sure if clubs are on or not.

As part of being a healthy school, we encourage children to drink water to keep them hydrated, especially in the heat. Children have access to cold water from our water fountain in the corridor so can refill their bottle when necessary.
