Clubs

After School Sports Clubs in September

In September we will be running a **Zumba club** for KS2 children and an **Archery club** for children in Years R, Y1, 2 and 3

These clubs will be paid for from the Government Sports Grant.

Last minute changes can cause confusion and result in not knowing who should be where. **If a child is unable to attend a club, then parents/carers need to inform the office in advance.** Children who have been signed up for clubs will be expected to attend unless we have been told otherwise by parents. This is to ensure that children are safe guarded.

Mondays—Zumba for Y3,4, 5 & 6 from 3.15—4.30pm (Monday 9th September—9th December)

Wednesdays – Archery for R, Y1, 2 and 3 (Wednesday 11th September - 11th December)

Friday – Multi-skills for Reception to Y6 3.15 – 4.30pm (Mr Bullock organises this— 6th September— 13th December)

Children must not go home unless we have had consent from a parent, Children should attend the club if they are registered for it.

PE Kits—Reminder

Children need their PE KIT in school every week. Please could you bring on a Monday and take home on a Friday to wash. It is a good idea to have some tracksuit bottoms in the bag in case the weather is colder. Please ensure the children's pumps fit!!

Labelling of School Uniform for Next Term

Please ensure that all of your child's uniform is clearly labelled as well as P.E kits and pumps. We have so many children who lose clothing that isn't named; this makes it very difficult for staff to track down the owners.

The school uniform consists of navy blue sweatshirt with logo, royal blue, red or green polo shirt with logo (house colours) worn with navy or plain black trousers or skirts.

For PE we ask children to wear plain navy or black shorts and plain white tee shirts and pumps. **Children are not allowed to wear any jewellery during P.E.**

House coloured checked gingham dresses can be worn in summer. We also have school baseball caps, which can protect heads from the sun.

Shoes should be worn not trainers please. In bad weather, boots and wellingtons need to be named, and pupils need to change into their shoes or pumps inside the school building.

SCHOOL MEALS

As we are at the end of the school year, please ensure you don't have any arrears on Parentpay, we do not want any outstanding debts/credits to be carried forward to September, as our financial year ends the end of August.

Thank you for your co-operation with this matter.

If your child is having school lunches in September, please pay on a Monday for the week/term ahead (lunches are free for children in Reception Y1 and Y2 and £2.50 per day for Years 3, 4, 5 and 6). If your child has milk, and they are aged 5 and over, (Milk is free up to the child's 5th birthday) the money must be paid via COOLMILK on the Tuesday before e.g. if you want your child to have milk in the first week back it must be ordered and paid for by **Tues 27th August.**

Our school milk scheme is administered by Cool Milk. To register your child for school milk, please visit <https://www.coolmilk.com/register>

If your child is under 5 they will have been registered using the bulk registration process but **parents still need to register using the form/website**. They will then get an e-mail when their child turns 5 reminding to make payment for milk when their child turns 5, in line with School Food Plan legislation. There are also links to Parentpay and Cool Milk on the home page. **Please remember not to pay for milk if you are going on holiday as they do not give refunds**. You need to pay for dinners and milk in advance.

Dinner menus are on the website or you can use the NYCC link <https://www.northyorks.gov.uk/school-meals> Holiday dates are also on the website for parents to refer to. There is also a link for a free school meals application, **please apply if you are eligible as school gets an amount per child to assist with their learning and to help with the cost of trips etc.**

Eyesight Checks - Reception Children

Eyesight checks have been carried out on 5 June 2019. If you have not heard from the Healthy Child Team, please assume that your child has passed their assessment.

We recommend that children have annual eyesight checks. These are free of charge under 16 years of age. Please register your child with an optician and schedule a review appointment in June 2020.
