Professional puppetry company Lempen Puppet Theatre are coming into Hawes School to run a unique after-school puppetry club for children.

Lempen Puppet Theatre, who did a popular performance for the children in The NASH last summer, will be running a six-session club called PUPPET TALENT, with five workshops taking place in Hawes School and a performance (by the children!) for friends and family in The NASH!

Lempen are one of the UK's great touring theatre companies and directors of the renowned

Skipton International Puppet Festival. Their workshops will focus on making technique, developing character & working on the puppetry skills required to animate & perform.

This is a special 'once-in-a-school-lifetime' opportunity, coordinated by The NASH and funded by NYCC's Inspire Fund, Roger Stott Community Grants and Richmondshire Area Partnership – thanks to them it will be free for children to take part.

Clubs – Summer term

We do not charge for many of the after-school clubs, however, the providers are paid for by the school.

Please return before Thursday 11th April if you want your child to take part in one of the clubs listed.

Events in school and beyond

Class 4 Residential Trip

Tournament of Song

school by 8.20am for registration as they will be leaving at 8.30am prompt, travelling on Fosters coach. Height and Weight Measurements for children in Year 6 and Reception

Every year in England, children in Reception and Year 6 have their height and weight measured as part of the National Child Measurement Programme (NCMP).

The NCMP provides information to help build an understanding of national and local trends in child weight. It is important to have a good understanding of how children are growing, so that the best possible advice and support can be provided for them and their families.

The measurements will be supervised by trained HDFT 5-19 Healthy Child Team staff at school in a private space away from other pupils. Children who take part will be measured fully clothed except for their coats and shoes.

The data from all schools in the area will be gathered together and held securely by our local authority public health team. Please note that we will store your child's information on their electronic health record which may be accessed by other professionals also providing care to your child, including their GP. No individual measurements will be given to school staff or other children, and all information will be treated confidentially.

The programme's data is used within the local authority and NHS to help plan the provision of services and advice to support healthy weight and lifestyles in the area. The information is also submitted for national analysis and publication in a way that means individual children cannot be identified.

After the measurements, if your child's measurements are above or below the healthy range you will be contacted by a member of the 5-19 Healthy Child team. This will provide an opportunity to discuss the result and provide additional advice and support including the NYCC Healthy Choices team. We will send you your child's results and information on healthy eating and being active within 6 weeks of measurement.

We do have spare kit which we lend out, but it is important that children are adequately resourced for their learning. We would expect that the child is taking responsibility for physically bringing their PE in to school.

Our school milk scheme is administered by Cool Milk. To register your child for school milk, please visit <https://www.coolmilk.com/register>

If your child is under 5 they will have been registered using the bulk registration process but **parents still need to register using the form/website**. They will then get an e-mail when their child turns 5 reminding to make payment for milk when their child turns 5, in line with School Food Plan legislation. There are also links to Parentpay and Cool Milk on the home page. **Please remember not to pay for milk if you are going on holiday as they do not give refunds**. You need to pay for dinners and milk in advance.
